The Herts at War team are delighted to announce that as of January 2014 the project has been funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and now forms one of the largest individual commemorative Great War Projects in the United Kingdom. The award of £98,400 until the end of 2015 now means that the project can develop a purpose built museum exhibition,

dedicated schools outreach programme, series of talks and tours and conduct a programme of county-wide events days to mark the key dates of The Great War 100 years to the day

Herts at War Volunteer Open Day

With the project now formally announced and the major task of researching the story of Hertfordshire during WW1 well under way, we have decided to run two separate open days where current and potential project staff and volunteers can come along, speak to the team and find out about the project plans for the future and have their say on what we should be focusing on. The first of these dates will **be Saturday 22nd**February in Letchworth Garden City and the second on Saturday 1st March in a central Hertfordshire location to be confirmed shortly by email and on our website.

Current Project Needs...

<u>Contemporary Newspaper Research</u> – With recently acquired digitized copies of several Hertfordshire newspapers covering every single week of the four year war, we are looking for individuals or groups to help trawl these fascinating documents, extract articles of interest and add to our database of information on the county's service personnel.

War Memorial Photography – Currently we have identified 608 war memorials and 791 Individual Great War burials within the county of Hertfordshire. One of our main aims in the run-up to August is to photograph and document as many of these as possible and display the images both online and in our upcoming museum exhibition. We are looking for individuals or groups who would be interested in achieving this goal, whether it be by visiting local churches or travelling to some of the lesser known, and sometimes altogether forgotten memorials that cover every corner of the county.
