Decision

The Sub-Committee have read the material presented to us and have listened to all the evidence and submissions. The Sub-Committee has considered the National Guidance and the Statement of Licensing Policy and has come to the following decision:

The application is approved subject to the following condition as suggested by 'Environmental Health' and agreed to by the applicant. This condition is:

All the emergency doors opening onto Park Street will be closed at all times with the exception of emergencies and reasonable deliveries.

The Sub- Committee have deemed this condition to be necessary for the prevention of public nuisance.

The applicant has agreed that they do not wish to be subject to the condition proposed at Q(e) on their application form and will comply with the standard provisions relating to the protection of children under the Licensing Act 2003.

The applicant has confirmed that they wish to retain their New Year's Eve and New Year's Day standard timings that they are currently entitled to under their Justice's Licence.

The Sub-Committee has confirmed that the special condition on their existing Justice's Licence that relates to occasional licences will not be converted onto the new licence as this requirement is inconsistent with the Licensing Act 2003.
