DECISION	The Sub-Committee have read the material presented to us and have listened to all the evidence and submissions. The Sub-Committee has considered the Licensing Act 2003, the National Guidance, their Statement of Licensing Policy and has decided: <u>To issue</u> a counter notice (preventing the temporary events)	
REASONS FOR DECISION	 The Sub-Committee has decided to issue a counter notice because they consider it to be necessary for the promotion of the crime prevention objective. In making this decision the sub-committee have taken into account the evidence of the Police and conclude that: 1. The previous history of disorder at these premises is sufficiently serious that the temporary events should not be permitted to proceed 2. Whilst the Sub-Committee consider that the applicant is acting in good faith and recognise the progress made by him, it is premature to permit this application given that a short period only has passed since the review hearing 3. The Sub-Committee consider that the restrictions placed upon the licence (and in particular the reduction of the hours at the review hearing) have proved effective and it would be incorrect to permit unrestricted opening hours under the temporary events application
