CONDITIONS DEEMED NECESSARY FOR THE PROMOTION OF THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES	The Sub-Committee recognises that conditions will <u>only</u> be imposed on a licence where conditions are necessary for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee will only impose conditions on a licence where relevant representations have been made and it considers that it is necessary to impose conditions as a result of these representations.
	The following conditions are each considered necessary by the Sub-Committee to promote the licensing objective of Prevention of Public Nuisance.
	The condition(s) are:
	No smoking shall be permitted other than in a designated smoking area to be agreed with the Licensing Authority and NHDC Environmental Protection.
	There shall be no consumption of alcohol outside the front of the building on Church Lane.
	3. When an event is held which will finish after 6pm signs shall be displayed at the exits of the building asking patrons to leave quietly and respect the rights of people living nearby to a peaceful night.
CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY THE RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES	None.
CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY APPLICANT	This licence will be subject to the conditions, that are consistent with the terms offered by the applicant in order to promote the four licensing objectives set out in Part P of their application, including the conditions agreed in advance with Hertfordshire Constabulary and NHDC Environmental Protection.

RATIONALE FOR DECISION	Having considered the evidence before it, including the Guidance and Council's Licensing Policy, the Sub-Committee consider that the applicant is taking appropriate steps to address the concerns of local residents. The Sub-Committee has imposed additional conditions on the applicant in order to reduce the potential for public nuisance to occur.  The Sub-Committee was reassured by the applicant's commitments made during the hearing that the premises will only supply wine, that delivery times will be limited in consultation with the school and steps will be taken to manage any potential parking issues. The Sub-Committee is mindful of the review mechanism in the event that the
COMMENCEMENT DATE	resident's concerns arise in the future.  This licence will come into effect from the date of this decision.
RIGHTS OF REVIEW	At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, such as the Police or an interested party, such as a resident living in the vicinity of the premises may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives. The review is a request for the Council to look at the existing licence and decide whether its conditions are adequate to meet the four licensing objectives defined under the Licensing Act 2003.
