This is an application for variation of a Premises Licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. The Sub-Committee has read the material presented to it and has listened to all the evidence and submissions. AUTHORITIES	
CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY APPLICANT	This licence will be subject to the conditions, that are consistent with the terms offered by the applicant in order to promote the four licensing objectives set out in Part P of their application, including the conditions agreed in advance between the applicant and the NHDC Environmental Protection Officer, as detailed in the report of the Senior Licensing & Enforcement Officer.
	Plus the following conditions proposed by the Applicant during the hearing:
	 There shall be no entry or re-entry to the premises after midnight. There shall be no external regulated entertainment. There shall be no karaoke. No later than ten working days prior to an International or National sporting event which falls outside the standard hours the licence holder shall contact the Licensing Authority to seek approval that the sporting event falls within the terms of the licence.
EFFECT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS EXPLAINED TO APPLICANT	The effect of failure to comply with any of the conditions attached to the licence or certificate is a criminal offence, which upon conviction, would result in a fine of up to £20,000 or up to six months imprisonment or both.
STATUTORY GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS	The Sub-Committee has taken into account the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (October 2010 version) in reaching its decision. It has found the following paragraphs to be of particular relevance in reaching this decision:
	Paragraphs 1.15, 1.16, 1.32, 2.4, 2.32, 2.33, 2.35, 2.36, 2.38, 10.12 and 10.20.
LICENSING POLICY CONSIDERATIONS	The Sub-Committee has taken into account the North Hertfordshire District Council's Statement of Licensing Policy in reaching its decision. It has found the following sections to be of particular relevance in reaching this decision.
RATIONALE FOR DECISION	Paragraphs 5.1, 5.9, 9.1, 9.2, 9.3, 9.4, 9.5, 12.2, 14.1 and 14.2. Having considered the evidence before it, including the Guidance and Council's Licensing Policy, the Sub-Committee note that the applicant is taking steps to address the concerns of local residents, including the further conditions offered during the course of the hearing. The Sub-Committee have decided to grant the application as applied for, save the additional hour on Friday and Saturday nights which the Sub-Committee considered to be the most noise sensitive periods for those living in neighbouring properties.
	The Sub-Committee has considered that the Applicant may wish to apply for the additional hour at some point in the future once he has operated the premises with the activities and times granted and can demonstrate no issues have arisen from the changes. The Sub- Committee is also mindful of the review mechanism in the event that the resident's concerns arise in the future.

COMMENCEMENT DATE	This licence will come into effect from the date of this decision.
RIGHTS OF REVIEW	At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, such as the Police or an interested party, such as a resident living in the vicinity of the premises may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives. The review is a request for the Council to look at the existing licence and decide whether its conditions are adequate to meet the four licensing objectives defined under the Licensing Act 2003.
