CONDITIONS DEEMED APPROPRIATE FOR THE PROMOTION OF THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES	The Sub-Committee recognises that conditions will <u>only</u> be imposed on a licence where conditions are appropriate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee will only impose conditions on a licence where relevant representations have been made and it considers that it is appropriate to impose conditions as a result of these representations.

CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY THE RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES	The following conditions have been recommended by the NHDC Environmental Protection Service and agreed by the applicant, and are considered appropriate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives, namely the Prevention of Public Nuisance:
	1. The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or some other person shall manage, where necessary, the external areas of the premises and the dispersal of patrons from the premises to ensure that noisy or rowdy behaviour is prevented and therefore noise disturbance to local residents is minimised.
	2. Clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all entrance and exit points and external areas of the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to keep the noise to a minimum.
	3. No drinks shall be permitted in the external areas of the premises after 2300hrs.
	4. After 2300hrs, the designated smoking area shall be located directly adjacent to the front entrance of the premises unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Council's Noise Control Officer.
	5. Deliveries and waste collections relating to premises shall only take place between 0800hrs and 2300hrs Monday to Saturday and 0900hrs and 2200hrs on Sunday.
	6. Glass bottles shall only be emptied into waste bins at the premises between 0800hrs and 2300hrs Monday to Saturday and 0900hrs to 2200hrs on Sunday.

CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY APPLICANT	 This licence will be subject to the conditions that are consistent with the terms offered by the applicant in order to promote the four licensing objectives set out in Part M of their application. Plus: The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or some other person shall regularly risk assess the need, or otherwise, for SIA approved door supervisors to be employed at the premises on given days and proceed accordingly.
EFFECT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS EXPLAINED TO APPLICANT	The effect of failure to comply with any of the conditions attached to the licence or certificate is a criminal offence, which upon conviction, would result in an unlimited fine or up to six months imprisonment or both.

RATIONALE FOR DECISION	1. The Sub-Committee was satisfied that the concerns raised by the interested parties had been addressed by the applicant.
	2. The Sub-Committee felt it was necessary for the Applicant to have a continuing regard for the need, or otherwise, to have SIA approved door supervisor present at the premises on a given day.
COMMENCEMENT DATE	This licence will come into effect from the date of this decision.
RIGHTS OF REVIEW	At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, such as the Police, or any other person that is affected by the application may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives. The review is a request for the Council to look at the existing licence and decide whether its conditions are adequate to meet the four licensing objectives defined under the Licensing Act 2003.
