Membership Rules and Guidelines

General Conduct and Etiquette:

- No loitering is allowed in front of the building or within 20 metres of the premises.
 This includes waiting for transport and smoking.
- Smoking is prohibited in front of neighbouring businesses, the barbershop located two doors away is suggested. Smoking must be limited to designated areas.
- Transport pick-up and drop-off should take place at the Market Square, not directly in front of the building.
- Noise levels must be kept to a minimum when entering or leaving the premises to avoid disturbing the neighbourhood.
- Smoking indoors is strictly prohibited.

Music and Entertainment:

- Songs should not be skipped during performances.
 Everyone's music choice must be respected.
- Respect the song choices and singing abilities of others.
 This is a space for enjoyment and encouragement, not criticism.
- Singers are encoraged to sing into the microphone and avoid shouting.

Substance and Alcohol Policy:

- The use or possession of drugs on the premises is strictly forbidden.
- No member or guest who is visibly intoxicated will be allowed entry.
 This applies at all times.
- No beverages are to be taken outside of the premises.

Entry and Exit Guidelines:

- Re-entry after 10:30 PM is at the discretion of management.
- After 10:30 PM, entry is restricted to members only.
- The front door must remain closed at all times, except for when entering or leaving.

Operating Hours:

- These guidelines apply every evening unless an extension has been granted by the authorities.
- The last song of the evening must conclude by 10:59 PM.
- Last orders for drinks will be taken at 11:30 PM.
- All guests must vacate the premises by 12:00 AM.

VIP Room:

- The last song in the VIP room must conclude by 10:00 PM.
- Windows in the VIP room must remain closed at all times.

Your membership will be revoked if the above rules are not adhered too.

<u>Data relating to the effectiveness of the curtain barrier installed to the outside of the premises with regard to attenuating music noise from within the premises.</u>

Toni Michelli requested that I conduct a test that demonstrates the effectiveness of the above curtain barrier. This data is not part of a more detailed report, nor is it conducted under ideal conditions, nor for significant duration, but it was carried out with calibrated Class 1 equipment in a duly diligent fashion.

These results indicate that the shop façade attenuates the sound by (91.7-59.1) = 32.6dB Broadband These results indicate that the curtain barrier further attenuates by (59.1 - 52.1) = 7dB Broadband

I have recommended that this data should not be used in isolation, but could be incorporated into a professionally prepared noise management plan when combined with other mitigating measures.

Industrial Acoustic Blanket

The high density acoustic blankets are a 5 layer composie product developed by our consultants and manufactured in our own factory. They consist of a high density internal noise barrier core sandwiched between two layers of our unique fire retardant quilted absorption pad and totally enclosed in a durable wipe clean surface.

The facing material is both fire retardant to Class '0' of the building regulations and the Silicone faced blanket is also water resistant making it suitable for internal or external use.

This acoustic blankets are supplied as modular units and can cover any size of aperture or area by co-joining with industrial Velcro machine stitched into the sides enabling many curtains to join together to form a singular unit creating a high performance acoustic noise barrier.

The blankets primary use is to screen off noise nuisance creating an effective barrier between the noise source and the receiver.

Hanging Options

They are designed to be hung from a fixed bar such as scaffolding poles, framework, Unistrut or any suitable fixing point and come supplied with eyelets for hanging.

Alternatively our blankets can be supplied with a track and trolley system to allow them to be movable.



Explanation of evidence to support objection to the Variation of the Premises License for UVA Wine Bar (Let's Party karaoke) 26 Bucklersbury, Hitchin, run by Mr Miceli (License no. 8057.

Four audio samples of noise from Let's Party (26 Bucklersbury), recorded on mobile phone inside bedroom 24/24a Bucklersbury during recent TENS (late-night temporary event notices).

Samples show noise as an ongoing nuisance after 11pm during these TENS. Samples are representative of recordings received by North Herts council via official Noise App on same days and similar times. Exception is 12th May – when maximum 5 recording reached on the Noise App. Together, they support the objection to the variation on the basis of Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise) and Prevention of Crime and Disorder (licensing hour breach).

- 1) Filename: 12th May First Late Extension
 - **Description**: Audio clip of singing and shouting **12th May** '**24** recorded at **01.18 am** (one hour and 18 minutes in breach of TENS license that should have finished at 12.30 am)
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise). Prevention of Crime and Disorder (licensing hour breach).
- 2) Filename: 14th June 23.20
 - **Description**: Audio clip **14th June '24 at 23.20pm**, loud singing (first day of three-day TENS).
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise).
- 3) Filename: 16th June Loud Dog recording-Description: Audio clip 16th June '24 at 00.04am of noise so aggressively loud that my dog is whining in fear (day three of a three-day TENS) Prevention of Public Nuisance (extreme noise after midnight).
- 4) Filename: 16th JuneHorrendousrecording

 Description: Audio clip 16th June '24 at 00.40 am (day three of a three-day TENS.

 Prevention of Public Nuisance (extreme noise after midnight).

Six video clips of disorder, street noise and antisocial behaviour from Let's Party recorded on house security camera.

Clips (screenshots ONLY included below) show evidence that disorder and noise associated with the venue is ongoing and not properly managed. Together, the clips support the objection to the variation on the basis of Prevention of Crime and Disorder (antisocial behaviour) and Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise).

1) Filename: 1719698933947

Description: Video **29th June 2024 23.08pm** shows antisocial behaviour/disorder not controlled by the venue (and seemingly actively encouraged). Mr Miceli points at house security camera for customers coming into the venue who gesture at it. **Prevention of Crime and Disorder.**

2) Filename: 1721424857539

Description: Video **19th July 2024 10.24pm** Rowdy drunk customers singing along to Tina Turner's 'Rollin' on the River', while running around in circles in the street, and shouting. **Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise).**

3) Filename: 1723322543628

Description: Video of **10th August 2024 21.42pm** Mr Miceli and friends talking loudly in the street, audible to every resident and passerby. **Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise)**

4) Filename: 1723327379013

Description: **10th August 2024 23.02pm** Rowdy customers shouting and singing as they leave. **Prevention of Crime and Disorder/Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise)**

5)Filename: 1724440832331

Description: Video **23rd August 2024 20.20pm** of antisocial behaviour: rowdy group of teenagers singing around table and then outside my house (third time they've done this). **Prevention of Crime and Disorder (anti-social behaviour). Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise)**

6)Filename: 1725129934164

31st August 2024 19.45pm onwards

Noise from customers talking loudly and shouting in street around a table. **Prevention of Public Nuisance (noise)**

PDF/Slide of a sample of Facebook activity from the Let's Party and Antonio Miceli Facebook sites, used to promote the venue.

PDF shows how Mr Miceli has been stirring up hostility towards residents on social media sites for many months: customers/followers refer to residents with abusive language, suggest forms of noise nuisance, anti-social behaviour, and threats to name noise complainants.
