#### (A) Unlawfully Parked Vehicles

Councillor Jim McNally to Councillor Paul Clark (Executive Member for Planning and Transport):

"Members were advised, via the MIS of 18 December 2020 that the minimum set period for observing vehicles unlawfully parked on yellow lines was to be reduced from 5 minutes to 2 minutes. The record of the decision taken under delegated authority states at paragraph 6.1 that 'The Executive Member for Planning & Transport & Deputy as well as other ward councillors have been informed and are supportive of the decision taken'.
