The Sub-Committee recognises that conditions will <u>only</u> be imposed on a licence where conditions are appropriate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee will only impose conditions on a licence where relevant representations have been made and it considers that it is appropriate to impose conditions as a result of these representations.

The following conditions are each considered appropriate by the Sub-Committee to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder, the protection of children from harm, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance The condition(s) are:

- to strengthen condition 29 of the operation schedule conditions the total capacity of admittance to the Arena is restricted to is two thousand (2,000) tickets on any event day
- to strengthen condition 29 of the operation schedule conditions the premises licence holder will ensure that 'live music' on the stage area of the event site will cease at 23:00 hours on Friday and Saturday and at 22:30 hours on Sunday
- 3. as part of the traffic management plan mentioned at operation schedule condition 6(h), the premises licence holder will ensure that all vehicular traffic on the event days will maintain access and egress to and from the event site via

	Blakemore End Road except disabled vehicles and vehicles for the campsite.	
CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY APPLICANT	This licence will be subject to the conditions that are consistent with the terms offered by the applicant in order to promote the four licensing objectives set out in their application and included as part of Appendix A of the Licensing Officer's Report.	
EFFECT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS EXPLAINED TO APPLICANT	The effect of failure to comply with any of the conditions attached to the licence or certificate is a criminal offence, which upon conviction would result in an unlimited fine or up to six months imprisonment or both.

RATIONALE FOR DECISION	 The Sub-Committee considered the representations of all the interested parties and were sympathetic to the concern raised by those present. However, the Sub-committee were satisfied that the Applicant had engaged a suitably specialised qualified team of experts to be able to properly promote the licensing objectives. 	
	2. In reaching its decision to approve the application, the Sub-Committee were mindful of the Council's Licensing Policy, in particular paragraphs B8 and D.8.1 which state that the Council encourages greater live music, dance, theatre and other forms of entertainment for the benefit of the community, and that where activities require a licence, the Council will	

	seek to balance the potential for disturbance of local residents and businesses against the wider community and cultural benefit. It was determined by the Sub-Committee, that allowing the application was consistent with this policy statement. 3. The Sub-Committee were concerned that the current traffic management plans were not very robust, it was therefore felt that an additional condition to address a particular concern was appropriate to promote the licensing objectives and recognises the need for effective management of traffic to and from the site on the public highway and strongly advise that the traffic management plan provides for effective	
COMMENCEMENT DATE	measures to safeguard public safety and nuisance objectives This licence will come into effect from the date of this decision.	
RIGHTS OF REVIEW	At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, such as the Police, or any other person likely to be affected by the premises, may apply to the licensing authority to request a review of the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives. The review is a request for the Council to look at the existing licence and decide whether its conditions are adequate to meet the four licensing objectives defined under the Licensing Act 2003.
