<b>DECISION</b>	<p>This is an application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.</p> <p>The Sub-Committee has read the material presented to it and has listened to all the evidence and submissions. The Sub-Committee has considered the National Guidance and the Statement of Licensing Policy and has come to the following decision:</p> <p><b>The sub-committee has decided to grant the application as applied for and detailed in Appendix E of the Licensing Officer's report.</b></p>
<b>EFFECT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS</b>	The effect of failure to comply with any of the conditions attached to the licence or certificate is a criminal offence, which upon conviction, could result in an unlimited fine or up to six months imprisonment or both.
<b>STATUTORY GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS</b>	<p>The Sub-Committee has taken into account the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (April 2018 version) in reaching its decision. <b>LICENSING POLICY CONSIDERATIONS</b>	<p>The Sub-Committee has taken into account the North Hertfordshire District Council's Statement of Licensing Policy in reaching its decision. <b>RATIONALE FOR DECISION</b>	The Licensing Sub-Committee have taken into consideration representations made by Environmental Health and the Other Parties but note that the Applicant has agreed Conditions with the Police in



	<p>Appendix E which relate to the operating hours of the roof terrace and that it should close at 22:00hrs. In view of this the Panel feel that they do not need to impose any further Conditions in respect of this licence.</p> <p>The Sub-Committee have also taken into account the revised application incorporating the Conditions agreed by the Police relating to the 21:30hrs finish time for outside performances and screenings.</p> <p>In making this decision consideration has been given to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Section 182 guidance of the Licensing Act 2003.</p>
<p><b>COMMENCEMENT DATE</b></p>	<p>This decision takes immediate effect.</p>
<p><b>RIGHTS OF APPEAL</b></p>	<p>An appeal may be made against this decision by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the applicant</li> <li>• NHDC Environmental Health</li> <li>• any other person who made relevant representations in relation to the application</li> </ul> <p>The appeal and appeal fee must be lodged with the Clerk to Stevenage Magistrates Court no later than twenty-one (21) days after the day on which the parties were notified by the Licensing Authority of this decision.</p> <p>Unlike today's hearing, an appeal at the Magistrates' Court has cost implications and the losing party may be required to pay the other party's legal costs.</p>
<p><b>RIGHTS OF REVIEW</b></p>	<p>At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority such as the Police, or any other person such as a resident, affected by licensable activities at the premises, may apply to the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.</p> <p>The review is a request for the Council to look at the existing licence and decide whether its conditions are adequate to meet the four licensing objectives defined under the Licensing Act 2003.</p> <p>At a review hearing, the sub-committee has a range of options available, starting with no additional action progressing through to revocation of the licence.</p>
