# 4. CHAIR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

JG welcomed everyone in attendance.

Highlighted that the Forum is an informal, inclusive meeting to share ideas.

Members were reminded to make declarations of interest before an item they may wish to abstain from voting if they have an interest, but they are merely making recommendations and not decisions.

#### 5. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN RELATION TO GRANT APPLICATIONS

The Community Partnerships officer informed those present that there is £15,000 available in the Southern Rural grant budget. The total amount of funding requested for the meeting was £2,198. If all grants are recommended and subsequently approved, there will be £12,802 remaining in the budget for the remainder of the financial year 25/26.

Received presentations in support of grant applications by the following:

Kate Wyatt and Beryl Whiting presented the Pirton Community Choir application.

Members enquired and received satisfactory answers about:

- Approaching their local Parish Council for support
- Looking into other funding streams to support the choir

## **Pirton Community Choir vote**

JG proposed to recommend £1,073. SP seconded.

DB abstained from voting due to Pirton Community Choir County Council Locality budget application.

CS declared an interest as a member of Pirton Community Choir and abstained from voting.

8 cllrs voted in favour of recommending Pirton Community Choir application for £1,073 towards the purchase of a piano stool, microphone boom, keyboard in addition to a case and stand.

# Gary Ewington presented the Whitwell 25 FC application.

Members enquired and received satisfactory answers about:

- How many games they are planning to play throughout the season.
- What other avenues of funding have been looked into.
- The hire of the pavilion.
- The potential for youth teams, a reserve team and a women's team

DB absented from voting due to a County Council Locality Budget application.

#### Whitwell 25 FC vote

JG proposed.

SP seconded.

10 cllrs voted in favour of recommending Whitwell 25 FC application for £1,125 towards the hire of the Recreation ground and pavilion.

Topics covered in the Q&A:

- What to do about missing stickers.
- New Comms Officer post has been filled.
- As part of the comms plan there are/will be leaflets, literature, digital comms, emails, social media and information shared to residents around the new bins and collection changes.
- The transition and handover of the service going live in August and around potential disruptions between moving IT platforms for service users.
- Councillors have direct contact with the Waste team if there is anything that needs to be raised/flagged. Cllr Allen is also happy to be contacted around any issues.

- How will areas, streets or residents know if they have missed the delivery of their bins.
- If residents haven't received their bins by mid July then please get in contact with the Council.
- Letters attached to the new bins being delivered with information on and weatherproof sticker.
- The work being carried about between the Waste, Comms and Customer Services team, particularly around the high volume of calls being received.
- People who have refused to accept and use the new bins and concern around littering and fly tipping.
- Enforcement on putting the incorrect waste in bins and the contamination of waste being collected.
- There is the option to request a larger, providing the home fits into the specified categories - Request a new, replacement or larger bin | North Herts Council
- How the bins are delivered and how to know if a home hasn't claimed the newly delivered bin.
- Councillors to help promote information on changes and signpost within their wards.
