<b>APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF THE PREMISES LICENCE</b>	<p>This is an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.</p> <p>The Sub-Committee has read the material presented to it. The Sub-Committee has considered the National Guidance and the Statement of Licensing Policy and has come to the following decision:</p> <p>The Sub-Committee has decided to grant the licence for the premises licence, subject to a condition.</p>

<p><b>EFFECT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS EXPLAINED TO APPLICANT</b></p>	<p>The effect of failure to comply with any of the conditions attached to the licence or certificate is a criminal offence, which upon conviction, would result in an unlimited fine or up to six months imprisonment or both.</p>

<p><b>RATIONALE FOR DECISION</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. In coming to its decision, the Sub-Committee has had regard to the application, the representation and the Applicant's response to the representation presented at the hearing. The Sub-Committee is mindful to strike a healthy balance between the application and the promotion of the licensing objectives.</li> <li>2. In addressing the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective, Members have taken a balanced approach and have considered the representation submitted. The Sub Committee is satisfied that the condition offered up by the Applicant will sufficiently promote the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.</li> </ol>
<p><b>COMMENCEMENT DATE</b></p>	<p>This decision will come into effect from the end of the period for appealing the decision (21 days starting tomorrow) or, if the decision is appealed, the point at which the appeal has been dealt with by the Magistrates' Court.</p>
<p><b>RIGHTS OF REVIEW</b></p>	<p>At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, such as the Police, or any other person, such as a resident</p>

	<p>living in the vicinity of the premises, may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives. The review is a request for the Council to look at the existing licence and decide whether its conditions are adequate to meet the four licensing objectives defined under the Licensing Act 2003.</p> <p>Ordinarily, a further review would need to focus on matters at the premises following this review, it should not be used to re-visit issues raised at today's hearing.</p> <p>The licensing authority can refuse a further review on the grounds that it is repetitious</p>
