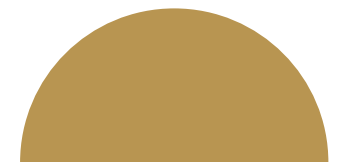

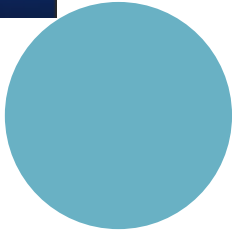

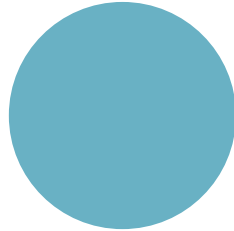
All welcome. Bring an instrument if you have one. Drop in and enjoy.
