<p>EFFECT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS EXPLAINED TO APPLICANT</p>	<p>The effect of failure to comply with any of the conditions attached to the licence or certificate is a criminal offence, which upon conviction, would result in an unlimited fine or up to six months imprisonment or both.</p>

<p>LICENSING POLICY CONSIDERATIONS</p>	<p>The Sub-Committee has considered the North Hertfordshire District Council’s Statement of Licensing Policy in reaching its decision. They have found the following sections to be of particular relevance in reaching this decision.</p> <p>Sections D2.1; D2.4; D2.9; D6.2; D6.3; E3.1.1; E.3.9.1; E3.9.2; O1.1; O4.1.4; O4.2.6; O4.7.1; O4.7.2</p>

<p>RATIONALE FOR DECISION</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In coming to its decision, the Sub-Committee has had regard to the application, the representations and the Applicant's response to the representations presented at the hearing. The Sub-Committee aims to strike a healthy balance between the application and the promotion of the licensing objectives. 2. The Sub Committee is mindful that the Other Persons do not object in principle to the application, however the objections raised are not a reason to refuse a licence where there is insufficient evidence to support the representations. 3. In addressing the prevention of public nuisance and the crime and disorder licensing objective, Members have taken a balanced approach and have considered the representations submitted. The Sub Committee is satisfied that the conditions noted in the operating schedule and that agreed between the Applicant and Environmental Protection & Housing Officer will sufficiently promote the licensing objectives to minimise the concerns surrounding the prevention of public nuisance in respect of noise from the licensed premises. There was insufficient evidence before the Sub Committee to support the crime and disorder licensing objective being undermined. 4. The Sub Committee had regard to the Other Persons' request for a condition to be added to the licence to limit the number of events held at the premises. There was, however, no evidence presented before the Sub Committee which indicated that such a condition was necessary to support the promotion of the licensing objectives.
<p>COMMENCEMENT DATE</p>	<p>This decision will come into effect from the end of the period for appealing the decision (21 days starting tomorrow) or, if the decision is appealed, the point at which the appeal has been dealt with by the Magistrates' Court.</p>
<p>RIGHTS OF REVIEW</p>	<p>At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, such as the Police, or any other person, such as a resident living in the vicinity of the premises, may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives. The review is a request for the Council to look at the existing licence and decide</p>

	<p>whether its conditions are adequate to meet the four licensing objectives defined under the Licensing Act 2003.</p>

Ordinarily, a further review would need to focus on matters at the premises following this review, it should not be used to re-visit issues raised at today's hearing.

The licensing authority can refuse a further review on the grounds that it is repetitious.
