<b>APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A NEW PREMISES LICENCE</b>	<p>This is an application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.</p> <p>The Sub-Committee has read the material presented to it and has listened to all the evidence and submissions. The Sub-Committee has considered the National Guidance and the Statement of Licensing Policy and has come to the following decision:</p> <p>1. <p><b>CONDITIONS DEEMED APPROPRIATE FOR THE PROMOTION OF THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES</b></p>	<p>The Sub-Committee recognises that conditions will <u>only</u> be imposed on a licence where conditions are appropriate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee will only impose conditions on a licence where relevant representations have been made and it considers that it is appropriate to impose conditions as a result of these representations.</p> <p>No further conditions were considered appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives..</p>
<p><b>CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY APPLICANT</b></p>	<p>This licence will be subject to the conditions that are consistent with the terms offered by the applicant in the operating schedule and agreed with the responsible authorities during the consultation period (as detailed in Appendix E of the report).</p>
<p><b>EFFECT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS EXPLAINED TO APPLICANT</b></p>	<p>The effect of failure to comply with any of the conditions attached to the licence or certificate is a criminal offence, which upon conviction, would result in an unlimited fine or up to six months imprisonment or both.</p>
<p><b>STATUTORY GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS</b></p>	<p>The Sub-Committee has taken into account the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (April 2018 version) in reaching its decision. It has found the following sections to be of particular relevance in reaching this decision:</p> <p><b>Sections 1.3, 1.4, 1.5, 1.16, 1.17, 2.1, 2.15, 2.16, 2.17, 2.18, 2.19, 2.22, 2.27, 9.42, 9.43 and 9.44.</b></p>
<p><b>LICENSING POLICY CONSIDERATIONS</b></p>	<p>The Sub-Committee has taken into account the North Hertfordshire District Council’s Statement of Licensing Policy in reaching its decision. It has found the following sections to be of particular relevance in reaching this decision.</p>

<p><b>RATIONALE FOR DECISION</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The Sub-Committee were encouraged by the fact that the Applicant had engaged in early discussions with the responsible authorities in advance of the hearing, and had agreed to additional conditions which satisfied them that the licence was capable of operating without putting the four licensing objectives at risk.</li> <li>2. However, having listened to all of the representations made during the course of the hearing, it was apparent to the Sub-Committee that the main concern expressed by the objectors was around the later end of the hours during which licensable activities could take place. It was therefore felt appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of public nuisance, that the hours should be reduced as outline above.</li> <li>3. On the matter of noise, the Sub-Committee were reassured by the inclusion of a noise limitation device that is an effective method of mitigating noise disturbance emanating from the premises. However, the Sub-Committee were also mindful of the possibility of disturbance being caused by persons leaving the premises late at night, as the surrounding area is residential in nature, and it therefore felt it was appropriate to restrict the times of operation as previously outlined.</li> </ol>
<p><b>COMMENCEMENT DATE</b></p>	<p>This licence will come into effect from the date of this decision.</p>
<p><b>RIGHTS OF REVIEW</b></p>	<p>At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority such as the Police, or any other person likely to be affected by the premises, may ask the licensing authority to review the licence if they believe that activities authorised by the premises licence are having an adverse affect on one or more of the four licensing objectives.</p> <p>If the application for a review is deemed appropriate, a licensing sub-committee hearing will be held following a twenty-eight day consultation period to consider the application and any representations received.</p> <p>The sub-committee has a number of options including no action, amending the licence, suspension or revocation of the licence.</p>
