OPERATING SCHEDULE CONDITIONS	The licence will be subject to the conditions offered by the applicant and agreed with the responsible authorities during the consultation period as detailed in Appendix D of the licensing officer's report (Conditions 1 to 21 inclusive).		
IMPOSED CONDITIONS DEEMED APPROPRIATE FOR THE PROMOTION OF THE LICENSING	The Sub-Committee recognises that conditions will <u>only</u> be imposed on a licence where conditions are appropriate for the promotion of one of the four licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee will only impose conditions on a licence where relevant representations have been made and it considers that it is appropriate to impose conditions as a result of these representations.		
OBJECTIVES	The following conditions are each considered appropriate by the Sub-Committee to promote the licensing objective of prevention of public nuisance.		
	The condition(s) are:		
	<ol> <li>The premises licence holder will ensure that consumption of alcohol by patrons is not permitted beyond eight (8) metres from the façade of the rear of the building. This area will be identified by temporary barriers/markings for the avoidance of doubt.</li> </ol>		
		nce holder will ensure that no patrons are premises after midnight, save for existing moking area.	
EFFECT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS	The effect of failure to comply with any of the conditions attached to the licence or certificate is a criminal offence, which upon conviction, would result in an unlimited fine or up to six months imprisonment or both.		

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STATUTORY GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS	The Sub-Committee has taken into account the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (April 2018 version) in reaching its decision. LICENSING POLICY CONSIDERATIONS	The Sub-Committee has taken into account the North Hertfordshire District Council's Statement of Licensing Policy in reaching its decision. RATIONALE FOR DECISION	<ol> <li>The Sub-Committee felt that by virtue of the conditions agreed between the Applicants and the Responsible Authorities, as well as the conditions agreed during the course of the hearing, that granting the licence would not put at risk the promotion of the four licensing objectives.</li> <li>The two conditions agreed during the hearing, namely around the permitted area for drinking on the field to the rear of the premises, and the restriction on admittance after midnight, were particularly appropriate, as these would seem to assuage the concerns expressed by residents that drinking at the far end of the field, and a migration of drinkers from the town at the end of the evening, would lead to a public nuisance.</li> </ol>		
COMMENCEMENT DATE	This licence will come into effect from the date of this decision.		
RIGHTS OF REVIEW	At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority (such as the police, fire, environmental health, etc.), or any other person likely to be affected by the premises, may apply to the licensing authority to request a review of the licence because of matters causally linked to the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives. The review is a request for the Council to look at the existing licence		
	following a period of public consultation, and decide whether it adequately promotes the four licensing objectives defined under the Licensing Act 2003.		
	At a review hearing, the sub-committee has a range of options available, starting with no additional action through to revocation of the licence.
