

TITLE OF REPORT: OPTIONS OPEN TO COMMITTEE HAVING CONSIDERED THE CALL-IN

The following options are open to the Committee:

- If, having considered the decisions(s), the Committee is still concerned about it, then it may refer it back to the decision making body (Cabinet) for reconsideration, setting out in writing the nature of its concerns; or refer the matter to Full Council *. If referred to the decision maker (Cabinet) they shall then reconsider within a further twenty clear working days, amending the decision or not, before adopting a final decision (Paragraph 6.3.11(v) of the Constitution); OR
- If, following an objection to the decision(s), the Committee decides not refer the matter back to the decision making person or body (Cabinet), the decision shall take effect on the date of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee meeting (Paragraph 6.3.11(vi) of the Constitution).
- * If the matter was referred to Full Council and the Council does not object to the decision(s) which have been made, then no further action is necessary and the decision(s) will be effective in accordance with the provisions below..

However, if the Council does object, it has no power to make decisions in respect of an Executive Decision, unless it is contrary to the Policy Framework, or contrary to or not wholly consistent with the Budget. If that is the case, the Council will refer any decisions to which it objects back to the decision making person or body (Cabinet), together with the Council's views on the decision. That decision making body (Cabinet) shall choose whether to amend the decision or not before reaching a final decision and implementing it

Where the decision was taken by Cabinet or a Committee of it, a meeting will be convened within five working days of the Council's request. (Paragraph 6.3.11(vii) of the Constitution).
